### Car Parking report goes to the Council

The DVS report into car parking in the village has now been completed. This is the result of the extensive consultation that we undertook late last year with a survey of residents and businesses, and culminated in a public meeting in January. Since then we have been working with our independent consultants to prepare this report which examines the issues in detail. At 23 pages it is far too long to print here in full, so here is a brief rundown.

The only proposal which had your extensive support was for some form of time limit in the village centre to discourage all-day parking. We are taking this forward, with a recommendation that parking is limited to two hours between 8am and 6pm on weekdays. There will be no pay-and-display or parking meters though. We're aware that this might displace some vehicles onto nearby residential streets, and the Council will be asked to monitor this in case further regulation is needed.

All other suggestions were carefully considered, but were ultimately rejected through lack of support, impracticality, cost grounds or simply because no practical solution was found.

The report will now go through to the Council and if they agree with the recommendation funding will probably be allocated for the financial year 2013-14, so nothing's going to happen immediately.

By the time that you read this the full report should be available on the Society's website (www.dorevillage.co.uk/carparking). It's in an easily downloadable format suitable for printing. If you don't have internet access the DVS has a few printed copies which will be available at the Dore Show, or call in on one of our open mornings.

### Thank you


The Jubilee Planning Group would like to thank Dore Village Society for its support and the residents of Dore for making the Jubilee Celebrations such a success.

It takes many hours of planning, preparation and petalling to produce these lovely well dressings. It was a pity that the Village Green was just too sodden for the Welldressing Service to take place there but a good crowd attended the Parish Church. ### **Dore Neighbourhood Plan**

Ten years ago the Dore Village Society began preparation of a Village Design Statement that eventually was published in 2005. The document, which was delivered to all houses in the village, described the character of the village, the development pressures, and ideas for preserving and enhancing the village and its surroundings. Whilst the document never became part of the statutory planning system it helped the village community to better understand the attractive character of the place where we live and to support efforts to positively care for the local environment.

The Dore Village Society now has the opportunity under the Localism Act 2011 to be designated a Neighbourhood Forum, the body able to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan. Under the Act the plan would become part of the statutory planning system which would form the basis of all planning decisions in the village and its environs. The regulations of the Localism Act require the area of the Neighbourhood Plan and the structure of the Neighbourhood Forum to be publicly advertised before Local Authorities can approve them.

The neighbourhood plan would have to be prepared in accordance with the Peak Park Authority and Sheffield City Local Plans, and would need to be prepared in consultation with both planning authorities. All residents, local businesses, community groups and statutory bodies would also be consulted. Local people will be expected to be involved in preparing the plan. Ultimately the draft plan would be advertised and a local referendum held where, in order to be approved, over 50% of those voting from the village would need to approve it.

The Neighbourhood Plan would build on the consultation and work undertaken as part of the Village Design Statement process. We could look more closely at developing local planning policies for the Peak Park areas of moorland, the Sheffield Green Belt, conservation areas, existing housing areas, the new housing site at the former King Ecgbert's School, open spaces, the Village Centre and traffic and transport issues.


If there were any objections to the proposals that couldn't be resolved through consultation the proposed plan would go to a public inquiry and an independent examiner would make their recommendations to the City Council before the plan could be made by the Council.



### Retiring after 107 years at King Ecgbert

Three teachers are retiring at the end of the term, having clocked up 107 years at King Ecgbert between them. Mr Rouse, Mrs Fitzpatrick and Mr Appelhoff all joined King Ecgbert in the mid 1970s. We thought it would be good to ask them about how it was at King Ecgbert in the 1970s and the changes they have seen in the five decades they have been here.

There were assemblies every day (singing the Lord's Prayer, 2 hymns + 2 Bible readings). The school day had 7 periods and finished at 4.05 pm. The school was split between two sites. Students were divided into Lower School (Mercia site) and Upper School (Wessex site) and teachers crossed between buildings carrying boxes of text books while the students were left unsupervised! There were occasional staff meetings, but staff were pretty much left to get on with things on their own. Lunchtimes were much longer. There were lots of clubs and activities for the students, and staff even had time to play bridge in the staffroom, run cross-country and play volleyball (not at the same time though).

Technology has certainly revolutionised education – back in the 1970s everything was 'chalk and talk' and working from (largely) dull textbooks and worksheets printed on 'Banda' machines. The most

sophisticated piece of equipment was the Overhead Projector. No whiteboards, photocopiers or computers. Subjects such as electronics and ICT just didn't exist. Students who staved into the 6th form studied a narrow range of A Levels with only a few (7% nationally) going on to University. There were no vocational courses or work experience. Exams were largely based on factual recall and there was no coursework. There were O Levels for the top 25%, CSEs for the middle 50% and nothing for the rest - they did not stay for exams and were known as the Easter Leavers. There was no National Curriculum and schools could teach what they wanted (RE was the only compulsory subject!). Schools were inspected very occasionally before Ofsted came along in the 1990s and were free from the current national obsession with data, targets and league tables. There was little money spent on the upkeep of the school and the buildings slowly fell into disrepair until much needed investment brought the new building in

So, much has changed, but some things seem to be coming round full circle with Mr Gove's recent announcement about the return to O Levels and CSEs!

### **Dore Parish Church news**

At its meeting in June, Christ Church's PCC gave careful consideration to the proposals for the development of our church building that had been presented by the church architect, and received a digest of the feedback provided by the Response Forms that had been completed. In all, 112 responses were received and they included some very helpful content. As you would expect, given the variety of our Church and community membership, the responses covered a broad spectrum. We have always known that it would be impossible for whatever is done (or not done) to meet with everyone's approval.

In the light of the architect's proposals and this feedback the PCC thought carefully about the best way in which we should now move forward. Taking account of both the present membership and the future mission of Christ Church, the PCC decided the following:

- a) We should choose an option that involves the refurbishment of the existing pipe organ rather than one that replaces it with a digital organ.
- b) We should seriously pursue the architect's option which together with the retention of the pipe organ – includes the provision of a gallery and the moving of the chancel arch. While this is clearly a major decision, much further groundwork needs to be done. The PCC is very well aware that there are some big questions about financial implications and design details which need to be clarified and it has asked the Church's Standing Committee to look into these and report back. The PCC intends to keep both the church and the community aware of the progress of the ongoing discussions.

By the nature of their role, clergy are often birds of passage. July marks both the tenth anniversary of Linda's and my moving to Dore and sees our departure from it. We have appreciated belonging to the community here and wish you well as it continues to develop. Though clergy move, the life of the Church here continues and in addition to the regular weekly pattern of worship Christ Church will mark a number of special occasions in the autumn.

- On September 30th, in company with many churches across the country, we shall be
  celebrating 'Back to Church' Sunday, a day when there is special encouragement to
  those of us who used to go to church in the past but have got out of the habit of doing
  so to make a return visit.
- The following Sunday, October 7th, will be our Harvest Festival.
- October 14th sees the local churches from S17 meeting together at 10.30am in King Ecgbert School for our second joint service of the year.
- Our 5.30pm service on November 4th will be a Memorial Service, when we particularly remember those from the Parish and community who have died during the past year and others who have been precious to us.
- On Remembrance Sunday, November 11th, there will be the traditional short Ceremony of Remembrance at Dore War Memorial starting at 10.45am.

### Our regular pattern of Sunday worship is:

8.00am A said service of Holy Communion (a quiet meditative service)

10.00am A service that includes music (normally a mixture of band and organ), prayers, Bible reading and teaching. It aims to be appropriate for a wide range of people with a big age-spread. Our children's groups run in parallel with this service and there is also a crèche.

5.30pm A quieter choral service, normally either Evensong or Holy Communion, with organ and robed choir.

We also have a short said service of Holy Communion at 10.30am every Thursday.

### Purple Poppy Appeal: Remembering the animal victims of war

The release of the epic film, 'The War Horse', in 2011 did a lot to raise awareness about the service and suffering of animals in wars. Unfortunately for most, there was no fairytale ending. During the First World War 8 million horses were killed or abandoned to die in Europe.

Dolphins, seals, pigs, monkeys, dogs, rats, goats, pigeons, horses are just some of those that have been used as tools in human conflict, as beasts of burden, messengers or for scouting, detection or rescue. Millions are abandoned in farms, zoos and homes in war zones. Animals are also being used in military research in laboratories to test chemical, biological and other weapons.

In 2004 a monument in London's Park Lane was dedicated to the gallantry of animals that have served and died alongside British and Allied forces in wars and campaigns throughout time. Alongside the red poppy you can now extend your compassion and remember the animal victims of war by also purchasing a purple poppy. These will be available this year from:

### How to report dog fouling

Your intrepid editor has been on the case, further studying dog poo. I recently met with Mark Parry, the Council's man in charge of dog pooh, and I was given assurances that patrols in our area will increase, and that the poor number of prosecutions generally in Sheffield will increase to levels nearing neighbouring cities, these being three times higher than in Sheffield. Patrols will not only cover the streets of Dore but our parks as well.

The bizarre practice of bagging pooh and then leaving the bags in bushes etc carries exactly the same penalties, as it is quite simply littering.

Mr Parry has asked for our help in not only getting the mess cleared, but in reporting the offending owners to secure convictions.

To report dog mess please contact environmental services on 0114 203 7410. You will need to tell them the exact location of the dog fouling.

The following details regarding reporting an owner are taken from the council website.

### If you witness dog fouling you will need to tell us

- The day, date, location and time that the incident occurred
- A description of the person in charge of the dog at the time the incident occurred.
- A description of the dog that they were walking
- If they arrived in a vehicle, a description of the vehicle
- How far away you were when the incident occurred.
- What kind of view you had

### Response times/Next steps

We aim to respond to all complaints as soon as possible after their receipt. If the report is a new or isolated incident, the information will be used to help build up a picture of where the problem "hotspots" are. Action can then include patrols and improved publicity in the area. Where offenders are identified informal letters or formal action can be taken. A statement may be requested to support any evidence. Offences that are witnessed result in legal action – this may be a fixed penalty notice and/or prosecution.

We have joined forces with the Police, Sheffield Homes and Parks staff who will provide us with intelligence about dog fouling – together we will take action against irresponsible dog owners.

# Putting Life IN Years (PLINY) – telephone friendship groups research study

The University of Sheffield are working with Age UK Sheffield on a research study to find out whether telephone friendship can improve wellbeing in later life. The study is for people aged 75 years and over living in Sheffield. Telephone friendship encourages a small number of participants to talk about interests or everyday life during weekly conversations over the telephone. The telephone groups are facilitated by a trained Age UK Sheffield volunteer. ### The Chicken Lady

Many thanks for your emails over the summer period; if we can call it a summer! It's great to hear there are many more chicken owners for 2012.

Rain, rain, rain, that's how the summer of 2012 began. We chicken owners, and everyone else of course, became fed up of getting so wet. I haven't, however, had one single complaint from my hens (I'm sure they would find a way of letting me know if they were fed up...no eggs maybe?) Perhaps there's a good reason for this... when it rains, out pop all the snails, slugs and midges - which we hate of course, but what a fabulous year for chickens! I've never seen my girls jump & hop around so much but of course it is the year of the Olympics - attempting to latch onto a midge, or a tug of war with a slug, boy they've really being going for gold this year! How easy they are to please.... If only we could feel this happy when it rains, fingers crossed for sunshine the rest of the year sorry chickens!

Chickens really do liven up any back garden with their many plumage colours, their delightful entertainment and of course their perfectly formed eggs. Nonetheless how do you know if you have a perfect egg? Sporadically I find myself inspecting more carefully the details of my girls eggs Do my girls lay the perfect eggs? well to be truthful not all of the time. On occasions I find an uneven egg (bumps within the outer shell) and from time to time an elongated egg is laid. Then, very rarely, an exceptionally oversized egg can be laid which in turn makes my eyes water marvelling at who and how they laid such a hefty egg, without hearing an ear-piercing shriek coming from up the garden! The big ones usually end up with a double yolk. I'm relieved I'm not a chicken! A perfect egg is smooth to the surface with a flat-shine (amazingly like

eggshell paint you will be surprised to hear) although I've still yet to catch my chickens out with Mr Sheen! This year Dore show is having "the best egg" entry so all you chicken keepers please bring along those wonderfully and perfectly formed eggs and give it a go!

With Autumn fast approaching I'd like to pass on a little tip... if you are left with a blanket of fallen leaves in your garden collect them up on a dry day and put them into breathable bags leaving them in a dry place until the winter. The dry leaves make a great substitute for sawdust as a first class litter for your girls houses, plus a good money saver too! Especially helpful as our wonderful green garden waste collection service has been withdrawn! Of course this is also good for any other outdoor pets (rabbits, guinea pigs, etc.) and not forgetting the hedgehogs; pile the leaves high in a quiet corner of your garden and who knows who may visit. When the day comes for cleaning out your hen houses, don't throw the waste in the bin, pop the soiled litter in your flower beds and borders, as this makes fabulous fertilizer (the broken down leaf foliage appearance is much more in keeping with the garden when compared to the usual sawdust).

My top tips for this coming autumn:

If like myself you enjoy allowing your chickens to roam freely from time to time around the garden but you are worried they will dig up your prize plants or spring bulbs - during the winter months lay chicken wire flat on your flower beds, the plants will grow up through the wire the following spring but the hens (and more importantly and much more of a nuisance – squirrels) won't be able to dig them up.

A good money saving tip: giving your hens daily greens is important, just as everyone needs their five a day. If they are in a pen with bark chippings or have eaten and scratched away the green grass then buying a lettuce or cabbage to keep them in good health is a great idea although it can get a bit pricey. A cheaper alternative is to cut a little ash, beech or even short grass from your garden and pop it in the run, its free and will keep your chickens entertained for hours whilst they remain within their run. Always make sure you know your plants before feeding them to any pets as there are sure to be plenty of poisonous plants in our gardens including foxgloves and laburnum.

Happy chicken keeping this autumn and don't forget to keep a watchful eye out for Mr Fox.






